



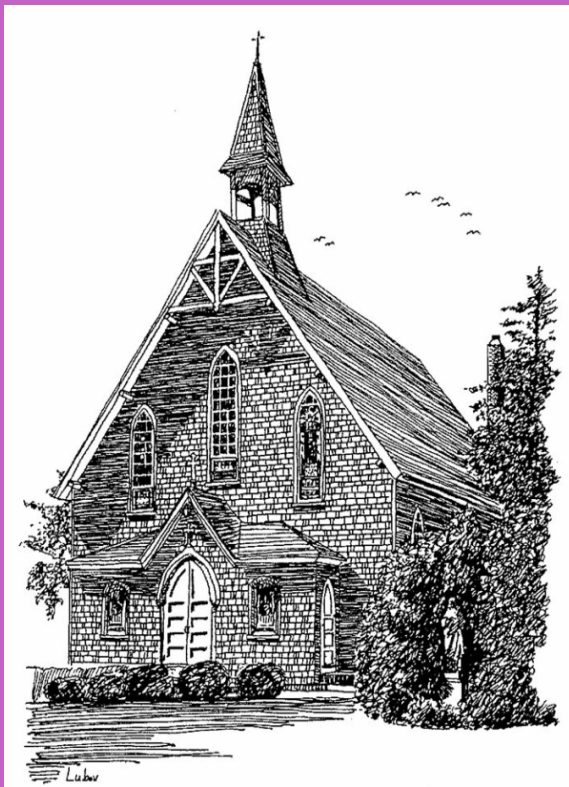

They will all be gathered by the end of the day, Monday, April 15th.



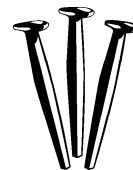
Tenebrae is a Latin word meaning “shadows” or “darkness.” It is an ancient ceremony in the church, dating back as far as the Middle Ages.

Held in Holy Week, usually on Holy Thursday or Good Friday, it was comprised of Matins, Lauds and Psalms. Hymns are interspersed among the prayers.

We, at Our Lady of Good Counsel, will be holding a *Tenebrae* service in Holy Week. Unlike the “high liturgy” in the ancient church, our *Tenebrae* will feature accounts from several of those who came into contact with Jesus during his ministry on earth, for example, Judas, the Centurion, Martha, etc. The service can be quite dramatic. Each speaker will have a light. At the end of his or her account, the light is extinguished. After the final account, the church is in total darkness, except for the great candle on the altar, symbolic of the risen Christ.

All are invited to attend the *Tenebrae*, a service of shadows, which will be held on Tuesday of Holy Week, April 16th at 7:30pm in Our Lady of Good Counsel Church. Hopefully, the impact of the ritual will serve to increase a more spiritual awareness of the solemnity of the Triduum at the end of Holy Week.

On Good Friday, our parish will take up the annual Good Friday Collection for the Holy Land. Each day, the news reminds us of the violence and instability plaguing the Middle East, but we rarely hear of the shrinking Christian community there, a community that struggles to remain in the land of Christ’s birth, death and resurrection. NORTH FORK PARISH OUTREACH UPDATE

"Toothpaste! I can't believe you have toothpaste!" exclaimed a Pantry visitor, over-the-moon delighted that she was able to get a necessity not covered by the Food Stamp program. "And deodorant! You have deodorant, too!" Her gratitude amplified.

For those whose life is a year long Lent of daily struggle and suffering, the people who donate to the North Fork Parish Outreach Pantry are like Simon of Cyrene, helping the less fortunate carry their cross of food insecurity. In addition to the good parishioners who donate to their parish food collections, there are some local organizations and individuals who target specific Pantry needs, filling in empty spots on Pantry shelves, providing necessities like toothpaste and deodorant.

To bear the burden of others by offering a bit of relief is at the heart of the Lenten season. The Pantry visitors extend Easter blessings to all whose generosity helps to ease their burdens.

In March, the Outreach Pantry distributed 168 bags of groceries to 40 households, this total consisting of 117 individuals of all ages and races. Our March Overflowing Hearts Food Drive contributed 32 bags of groceries and \$518 to the Pantry. Our next Parish Food Drive is May 4 & 5.

We at the Outreach are privileged to serve our neighbors in need.



Thank you! Last weekend's Parish Lenten Food Drive saw the donation of 61 bags and boxes of groceries, \$100 in gift cards, and \$764 given from our parishioners to the North Fork Parish Outreach Pantry for distribution to our neediest neighbors.
